What kind of lodge is it?

This unique lodge provides a common forum for all Master Masons who have a real concern for preserving the past, recording the present, and influencing the future development of Freemasonry. The goal of the Lodge is to encourage the preservation of our Masonic heritage.

What are the objectives of this Lodge?

PRESERVE our Masonic heritage by developing an interest in this area of Masonic endeavour: RESPOND to questions about our Masonic heritage: PRODUCE authentic historical papers for presentation and printing: MAINTAIN an inventory of archival and museum artifacts: PROMOTE interest in lodges and Masons for Masonic heritage: DEVELOP a Masonic museum: ENCOURAGE Masonic research into all aspects of Masonic history.

Who can join?

You! — any Master Mason interested in this Lodge programme.

Why should I join?

You can be part of an exciting development in Masonry. You can enjoy your Masonry by your contributions in our meetings, your letters of questions and contributions in our Correspondence Circle, and your assistance in researching our Masonic heritage in your district or your own Lodge.

When does it meet?

Regular meeting nights are the third Wednesdays of September, November, March and May.

Where does it meet?

The Lodge meets in the Cambridge Masonic Centre at the north-east corner of the intersection of Highways 401 and 24 for a business meeting and elections in September. The remainder of the meetings are held at various locations throughout the jurisdiction.

How may I get involved?

There is committee work, officer responsibilities, and program involvement, with emphasis on historical research, preservation, and presentation. Some current committee work includes the development of a Masonic museum, an archival survey, identification of valuable Masonic artifacts, and making information accessible to Masons doing historical research on subjects of their own choice.

What has this Lodge accomplished?

The Lodge already has a membership of about 600 Master Masons representing all Masonic districts in Ontario. As no degrees are conferred, a learned historical paper is presented at each regular meeting, followed by a question period. The paper is published in the Lodge proceedings and sent to all members. Attendance at the lodge is, therefore essentially necessary. The Lodge established and operates a display lodge room at Black Creek Pioneer Village.

How does the Heritage Lodge assist other Masons?

Through the Lodge's information service and Heritage publications a lodge historian, archivist, or researcher can receive assistance through personal contact or correspondence with members of The Heritage Lodge who have a common interest.

How do I affiliate?

Complete the application for affiliation and send it to The Heritage Lodge enclosing your cheque for \$55.00 inclusive of affiliation fee and your first year's annual dues which are \$55.00 from September 1st to August 31st. In order to maintain membership in The Heritage Lodge, you must maintain membership in a Craft lodge in this jurisdiction.
